Thank you for consulting the Cotswolds Conservation Board ('the Board') on this proposed development, which would be located within the Cotswolds National Landscape.<sup>1</sup>

In reaching its planning decision, the local planning authority (LPA) has a statutory duty to have regard to the purpose of conserving and enhancing the natural beauty of the National Landscape.<sup>2</sup> The Board recommends that, in fulfilling this 'duty of regard', the LPA should: (i) ensure that planning decisions are consistent with relevant national and local planning policy and guidance; and (ii) take into account the following Board publications:

- Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) Management Plan 2018-2023 (<u>link</u>);
- Cotswolds AONB Landscape Character Assessment (<u>link</u>) particularly, in this instance, with regards to Landscape Character Types (LCT) 2 (Escarpment) and 7 (High Wold);
- Cotswolds AONB Landscape Strategy and Guidelines (<u>link</u>) particularly, in this instance, with regards to LCT 2 (<u>link</u>), including Section 2.2 and LCT 7 (<u>link</u>), including Section 7.2.
- Cotswolds AONB Local Distinctiveness and Landscape Change (<u>link</u>);
- Cotswolds Conservation Board Position Statements (<u>link</u>) particularly, in this instance, with regards to:
  - Dark Skies and Artificial Light Position Statement (<u>link</u>) and its appendices (<u>Appendix A Night Lights</u>, <u>Appendix B ILP Guidance</u> and <u>Appendix C CfDS Good Lighting Guide</u>);
     and
  - o Tranquillity Position Statement (<u>link</u>)

## Lighting

Although little detail has been submitted by the applicant, the Board notes that the application includes proposals for outdoor lighting in the courtyard, terrace and pool areas of the new dwelling. Whilst the applicant's Design & Access Statement states that the proposed lighting will be kept to an absolute minimum so as to ensure no harmful impact to the unlit character of the local landscape, this lighting would introduce a 'lit element' into what would otherwise be a relatively dark night-time landscape.

The Cotswolds AONB Landscape Strategy & Guidelines for LCT 2 (Section 2.2) identifies 'the introduction of lit elements to characteristically dark landscapes' as a potential (adverse) implication for isolated development such as this. The guidelines seek to 'conserve areas of dark skies', with these dark skies being one of the 'special qualities' of the Cotswolds National Landscape. This is particularly important in an area with relatively low levels of light pollution such as this, as indicated in Appendix 1 of the Board's Tranquillity Position Statement, referred to above.

As such, the introduction of any lit elements should be designed to adhere to this guidance and, by extension, with the policies of the Cotswolds AONB Management Plan in particular Policy CE5 (Dark Skies). Without prejudice, if the local authority is minded to grant planning permission, we recommend that planning conditions should be imposed which seek to mitigate any adverse impact and ensure that all lighting will be limited to low-level, down-facing lights.
