Background

Introduction

- 1. At its meeting of 19th July 2018 the Executive Committee agreed to have a table summarising progress in applying for external funding included as a standing item on the Executive Committee's agenda. This table is included below; **Appendix 'A'.**
- 2. At its meeting of 17th September 2019 the Executive Committee agreed a new framework and template for taking forward project proposals internally. In accordance with this, projects that will have templates completed if or when they are sufficiently worked up for an Expression of Interest stage are:

 - A new expression of interest for the Green Ribbon of the Evenlode Valley
 - Engaging young people, subject to the scale of delivery effort required
 - A new Landscape Enhancement Initiative bid for Window 8
