COTSWOLDS LEADER PROGRAMME UPDATE

Summary: To present an update on the progress of the LEADER Programme

General Items

1. Exchange Rate gains

All LEADER Programmes have benefited from additional resource as a result of an exchange rate change from $\in 1euro = \pm 0.80$ to $\in 1euro = \pm 0.88$. This change was applied to the uncommitted and committed and unspent portion of the allocation up to 31/07/2018.

2. 22% Running Costs Animation (RCA)

RPA has approved RCA spend of 22% for Cotswolds. For the Cotswolds to fully utilise this extra resource, the most important thing is to contract as many quality projects as possible in the time we have left. This will ensure the Programme has sufficient resource post March 2019 for programme management and monitoring & evaluation.

3. Full Application Training session: 22/08/2018

This was the second training session run this year. It was attended by 10 applicants/ agents from the final tranche of full applications.

4. Programme Timing

- The cut-off date for Expressions of Interest was Friday 31 August 2018.
- The cut-off date for receipt of Full Applications is Wednesday 31 October 2018
- All projects must be approved and contracted by Friday 29 March 2019*
- All grant payments must have been made by 31 December 2020

*We have requested a 4 month extension to this date to 30/07/2019, which is currently being considered by the RPA.

6. <u>Programme performance</u>

The programme has supported 29 projects (closed & contracted) with a total value of £893,455. Rural Payments Agency (RPA) statistics were distributed on 03/09/2018, summarised below:

Expressions of Interest (EOI) on desk

- The deadline for receiving EOI was Friday 31 August
- Lots of interest end of August
- 15 EOI with a collective value of about £455K

Total Contracted

- Cotswolds is ranked 48 out of 79 (1 being the best/79 worst)
- The total project allocation figure has increased from £1,638,688 to £1,799,361, an increase of £160,672, which is attributable to the exchange rate gain.
- Consequently, the Cotswolds contracted figure has reduced from 56% in late July to 49.65% now. This is largely because of the exchange rate gain and also because of two recent withdraws of contracted projects.

Total Spend

- Project spend is currently £414K.
- Spend has slowed down over the summer as it is reliant on projects completing and submitting their claims so is reactive.
- There are a number of large spend projects due to complete this autumn, which will boost this figure.

7. <u>Are we are on track, are we going to deliver, will we over achieve or under supply?</u>

We currently have 3 full applications in appraisal, 3 full applications on desk and a further 16 full applications in development and due for submission by 31/10/2018. The 16 full applications in development account for the £720,988 in the Targets vs Actuals appendix. We have up to 15 EOIs that could also be invited to full application, which would help mitigate for withdraws. This is important because the withdraw rate has been quite high – 8 since the end of July, including 2 contracted projects.

Whilst we have enough applications to reach the Cotswolds spend and jobs targets, there is insufficient resource to process them in the remaining time. As predicted at the start of the summer, the large number of full applications submitted at the end of October will create a bottleneck in our processing ability. The Board should be prepared for a degree of underspend.

8. Voluntary surrender of funds

RPA has advised that should a LEADER group thinks it is unlikely to utilise its full allocation, it could surrender project funds for reallocation nationally. LEADER groups surrendering funds need to complete a Variation Request by 19/09/2018. A week earlier on 12/09/2018, RPA is conducting an exercise on DORA to identify

LAGs that require extra project funding. The Cotswolds LAG will review the likelihood of spending the full allocation and the potential for voluntary surrender of funds at their meeting on 12 September.
