#### **COTSWOLDS LEADER PROGRAMME UPDATE**

### 1. Programme costs

The Board claims the expense of delivering the Programme from the Rural Payments Agency. We are up to date with this and currently claiming for the Jan-March 2019 period.

#### 2. Programme Timing

- All projects must be approved by 31st July 2019
- All projects must be contracted by 27<sup>th</sup> September 2019
- All grant payments must have been made by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020

## 3. Remaining LAG Meetings

- Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> May 2019
- Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> July 2019

#### 4. Programme performance

The programme has supported 44 projects (closed & contracted) with a total value of £1,446,870, which represents 82.5% of the allocation. Collectively this investment has created 67 new jobs.

# 5. Are we are on track, are we going to deliver, will we over achieve or under supply?

The target is to allocate the remaining allocation of approx. £300K over the next two LAG meetings in May and July. Those applications approved at the July LAG must be contracted by 27 September. We are aiming to get six full applications to the May LAG with a collective value of £150K with the balance being considered at the July LAG.

In terms of spend, 29 out of our 44 projects have successfully completed their project and claimed their grant. This equates to £775K. We are currently processing four project claims.
