COTSWOLDS LEADER PROGRAMME UPDATE

1. Programme Timing

- All projects must be approved by 31st July 2019
- All projects must be contracted by 27th September 2019
- All grant payments must have been made by 31st December 2020

3. Programme performance

The programme has supported 49 projects (closed & contracted) with a total value of £1,587,529, which represents 90.45% of the allocation. Collectively this investment has created 71 new jobs.

In terms of spend, 32 out of our 49 projects have successfully completed their project and claimed their grant. This equates to almost £875K.

4. Are we are on track, are we going to deliver, will we over achieve or under supply?

We are aiming to process as many of the remaining full applications as possible for consideration at the 31 July LAG meeting. There is approx. £167K left to allocate. There are more applications than remaining resource so not all applications will be successful.

The job creation figure is a little under the original target, although still a healthy outcome. This is largely because the programme allocated more to farming projects than originally envisaged, which typically do not create jobs.

Work has begun on a comprehensive end of programme report that will be produced by the end of 2019. After the last LAG meeting, work on the report will accelerate.
