# SOUTHERN COTSWOLDS LANDSCAPE ENHANCEMENT PROJECT PROJECT PROPOSAL: EXECUTIVE BRIEFING

**Summary:** A project proposal that outlines plans to allocate £500,000 of Network Rail funding as capital grants for projects in the AONB, to compensate and mitigate for the adverse impacts of rail electrification works.

#### **Summary of the Project**

- 1. The Southern Cotswolds Landscape Enhancement Project will administer a £500,000 fund to support capital projects that mitigate and offset the adverse visual impacts of rail electrification works in the Cotswolds AONB between Old Sodbury (South Gloucestershire) and Alderton (Wiltshire).
- 2. A Project Officer has been appointed to devise and manage the project, which will run for two years, from January 2020 to January 2022. Their employment started on 13/01/2020 and they will be working 0.5FTE for the duration of the project, line-managed by the Planning and Landscape Officer.
- 3. The funding was provided by Network Rail (NR) as part of a legally-binding 'settlement agreement'. This represents the full and final settlement of NR's liability (in relation to works completed to-date) arising out of their statutory duty to have regard to the purpose of AONB designation.
- 4. All grants awarded must help finance capital projects that support the Cotswolds Conservation Board's statutory purpose:
  - a) To conserve and enhance the natural beauty of the Cotswolds AONB
  - b) To increase the understanding and enjoyment of the special qualities of the Cotswolds AONB
- 5. Additionally, the 'settlement agreement' splits the funding into two sums, which are targeted at different outcomes:
  - a) £250,000 was allocated as the 'Cotswolds Project Sum', to fund compensation projects
  - b) £250,000 was allocated as the 'Cotswolds Mitigation Sum', to fund mitigation projects
- 6. After hosting and project management costs have been deducted, just under £410,000 remains available for project delivery. This will be administered via two grant programmes (£205,000 each), designed to account for and deliver the different outcomes required of each sum:

#### a) Southern Cotswolds Enhancement Programme

i. This will administer the 'Project Sum'

- ii. Landscape conservation and enhancement will be a priority, as will proximity to the railway, but any project that supports the Board's statutory purpose, within 40km of the railway, may be eligible for grant funding
- iii. Projects will be identified through a process of stakeholder engagement and an open call for projects.

## b) Inner Rail Corridor Enhancement Programme

- i. This will administer the 'Mitigation Sum'.
- ii. The main focus of this programme will be on reducing the visual impact of the electrification works, for example through line-side planting, in the area directly affected (up to 3km from the railway).
- iii. Projects will be identified and developed through direct engagement with local communities, land managers and landowners.
- 7. The project will launch in spring 2020. Prior to this, further work is required to develop and finalise:
  - c) Detailed funding criteria
  - d) Communications and stakeholder engagement plan
  - e) Processes for project assessment and allocation of grants
  - f) Budget forecasts
