Background

Introduction

- 1. At its meeting of 19 July 2018 the Executive Committee agreed to have a table summarising progress in applying for external funding included as a standing item on the Executive Committee's agenda. This table is included below; **Appendix 'A'.**
- 2. The purpose of this paper is to provide a concise snapshot of progress across significant areas of project development. More detailed descriptions of projects in development and their potential impacts will be provided through the project proposal process at the appropriate time.
- 3. The National Lottery Heritage Fund have announced a £50 million response to the Coronavirus pandemic. To create capacity for this they have also announced that:
 - "We have halted all new Committee-level grants (£250,000-£5m) and single-stage delegated grants (£3,000-£250,000) until at least October 2020."
- A project proposal being brought to the Executive Committee as a result of the below is the Lodge Park bid to the Landscape Enhancement Initiative.(agenda item 10)

Window 7; Full application for Hampnett to Chedworth Boundary Restorations (dry stone walling) submitted 10th October. Project value £287,444, bid ask £199,999. National Grid panel keen to pass to Ofgem in February following further photography & mapping.

Window 8; We were thinking of applying to the 14th January deadline with the National Trust to help restore the Bridgeman Landscape at Lodge Park This project was first reserve from the last call. The £600,000 limit per protected landscape combined with the outcome of the existing 3 proposals would limit this application to £50k if our other bids are successful.

National Trust have decided to try for window 9 instead (June EOI and funding from April 20201). They have been advised that this will come from the next Ofgem price control period (T2) where the £600k limit will be reset, making way for a bigger bid.

In preparation for this a project proposal form is being brought to the Executive Committee in May.
