- 3. Uplift Revenue Funding:
 - New roles:
 - Climate Action Lead (Technical)
 - Climate Action Co-ordinator (Graduate)
 - Outdoor Learning Officer (50% match funding / 50% awarded by the Ernest Cook Trust)
 - Woodland Opportunity Mapping for the whole CNL (part funded by Gloucestershire County Council)
 - Upgrades to cyber security (365 Business Premium licences and Cyber Essentials certification)
- 4. Uplift Capital Funding:
 - o Replacement of all CNL boundary markers (c35-40) in the new brand style
 - Production of a one-year film documentary focusing on the farmed landscape of the CNL, a valuable asset ahead of the Cotswolds' 60th anniversary in 2026
 - Design and build of a new CNL website to ensure a best in class experience for online visitors
 - o Purchase of mobile defibrillators for volunteer work parties (Wardens and GCG)
 - New laptops and upgrades to existing laptops
- 5. Other areas of spend include: Wardens' tools and equipment; production of a series of accessible walks; event display materials; camera equipment; Grasslands equipment.
