OTHER ACTIVITY

1. New to Nature

We have been successful in our application to the 'New to Nature' scheme led by Groundwork UK. The scheme aims to increase the diversity of young people (18-25) entering the environmental sector, specifically those from ethnic minority backgrounds and people with disabilities. A trainee will join us for a year from April 2023, with the grant paying 90% of salary and NI. The balance will be paid using the remaining Kingfisher funds. The trainee will be based at GWT Robinswood Hill, which will offer greater opportunities for those without transport from Gloucester and surrounding areas.

The role - Grants and Outreach Officer - will be advertised from w/c 16 January. The successful candidate will co-lead Caring for the Cotswolds, work on improving access for communities inside and outside the Cotswolds and gain valuable skills and experience by working with our conservation and education teams.

2. Everyone's Evenlode

The 'Everyone's Evenlode' project enables children, young people and local communities to access, explore and enjoy their local river. The project is delivered through the Evenlode Catchment Partnership (ECP) and funded by Thames Water, as part of their Smarter Water Catchments initiative.

Key milestones

- Delivery of a full education and community outreach programme.
- The project milestones set with the ECP and funder have been achieved and evidenced.
- Community Outreach Officer role increased from two days to three days from October 2022, with additional funding secured in final year of delivery: April 2024 March 2025.
- Jennifer Lanham joined the team as the Community Outreach Officer in October 2022, replacing Ruth Rudwick.
- Education Officer role increased for an extra year to March 2025, in line with the Community Outreach Officer role. Extra funding secured for the final year of delivery: April 2024 March 2025.

Income and expenditure

- Income: £90,643 including £8,644 for hosting @15% of total employee costs.
- Expenditure: £38,905.32 to 30 September 2022.

3. Outreach/ Outdoor learning

Using external funding from several sources, we offer outdoor learning sessions to children and young people. For younger audiences, we've adopted a forest school style approach. For the older children and young people, sessions incorporate rural skills like woodland management and drystone walling.

Key milestones

- 255 session places delivered to children and young people up to 31 December 2022.
- A mixture of one-off sessions and multi-sessions offered.
- Reached students in five schools across the Cotswolds.
- Highlights include: delivering a nature-based session to 20 Year 10 students at the Al Ashraf school, in Gloucester, enabling 16 young people attend the Emergent Generation Conference at FarmED and providing two Royal Agricultural University students a 30-day work placement this summer.

Income and expenditure

- Kingfisher Trail: £16,453 carry forward from 2021/22 £3,249 allocated by March 23 on salary costs for James Webb
- Wates Foundation: £1,962.50 carry forward from 2021/22 allocated by August 22 on salary costs for Ed Bonn and James Webb

- Renishaw Charity Committee: £500 received and allocated in October 22 on salary costs for James Webb
- Thames Water: £9,738 carry forward from 2021/22 £3,320 allocated by December 22 on session costs
- Summerfield Trust: £1,650 carry forward from 2021/22 allocated by June 22 on session costs
